ORDINANCE 2025-02 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF ESTO, FLORIDA, GRANTING TO WEST FLORIDA ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE ASSOCIATION, INC., AN ELECTRIC UTILITY FRANCHISE WITHIN THE TOWN OF ESTO, FLORIDA.

In accordance with the provisions of controlling law, even notwithstanding the fact that an exemption noted above may apply, the Town of Esto hereby publishes the following information:

- 1. Summary of the proposed ordinance:
  - This ordinance renews a franchise agreement with West Florida Electric Cooperative Association, Inc. (WFEC) for a five-year term. It grants WFEC the non-exclusive right to use the public rights-of-way in the Town of Esto to provide electric service and includes provisions for the collection of a franchise fee equal to 6% of WFEC's gross revenue derived from customers within the Town.
- 2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, forprofit businesses in the Town of Esto, if any:
  - a) An estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur;
     There are no direct compliance costs anticipated for private businesses in Esto.
     WFEC is the sole entity responsible for compliance with the ordinance.
  - b) Any new charge or fee imposed by the proposed ordinance or for which businesses will be financially responsible; and <u>No new charges or fees are imposed on businesses. The franchise fee applies</u> <u>solely to WFEC.</u>
  - c) An estimate of the Town of Esto regulatory costs, including estimated revenues from any new charges or fees to cover such costs.
    - There are no new regulatory costs anticipated for the Town of Esto. The administration of the ordinance and collection of franchise fees will be managed using existing staff and processes.

- 3. Good faith estimate of the number of businesses likely to be impacted by the proposed ordinance:
  - Zero. No local businesses are expected to be directly impacted by this ordinance, as it applies only to the utility provider.
- 4. Additional information the governing body deems useful (if any):

This ordinance replaces a previous franchise agreement enacted in 2023 and provides for continued electric utility service without interruption. It ensures the Town receives a fair fee for WFEC's use of public rights-of-way while protecting local services and infrastructure.
